# Associateship of Canadian Surety Bonding Designation Program (A.C.S.B.)

The Associateship of Canadian Surety Bonding Designation Program (A.C.S.B.) aims to provide students with a theoretical and in-depth practical understanding of surety bonds and the suretyship process and it is intended for those who plan on embarking on a career in the surety industry.

## Who should take this program?

The program examines surety bonds and the suretyship process in some detail and was designed as a learning vehicle for students who plan on embarking on a career in the surety industry.

While it's not intended for individuals in other disciplines or industries, students from outside the surety world are welcome to take these courses.

#### Courses:

Students are required to complete six (6) courses; four (4) core courses and two (2) electives.

Three (3) of the four (4) core courses which have been developed by SAC, include :



SAC 101 - Principles of Suretyship



SAC 102 - *Contract Surety* 

SAC 103 - Construction & Surety Law

The fourth core course, Introductory Financial Accounting, and the two elective courses can be taken at any accredited Canadian university.

### How to register:

In order to receive the A.C.S.B. Designation, students are required to register for the program through the Surety Association of Canada prior to starting the first course.
